

Library Cards

Your first library card is free. Students under 16 must sign up with their parent at the library. Please bring a photo ID (license, learner's permit, or school ID) and proof of residency (license, bill, or piece of mail with your current address) to register for your library card.

Fine Policy

The Middleborough Public Library does not charge for overdue materials with the exception of Museum Passes returned late.

We do charge for lost items, materials returned with missing pieces, and items that have been damaged. Fees for such items are on a case-by-case basis and will most likely be the full replacement cost.

You cannot borrow items if: you owe **\$10.00** or more in fines or have a lost charge on your library card. Most library fines and fees can be paid online. Log on to "my account" on the SAILS Library Network.

Loan Periods

Books: 4 weeks (adult new books: 2 weeks)
Music, audio books, video games, magazines, and kits: 2 weeks
Movies: 1 week

Auto-renewal: checkouts are automatically renewed from the date due unless they have holds. You can notify us to opt-out of auto-renewals.

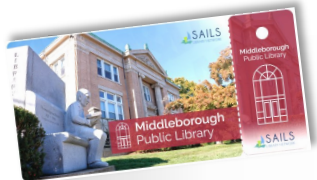

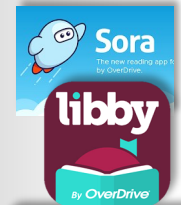
Read, Listen & Watch
